Review of The Week

Early Years

Nursery

All Nursery children have returned happily following the holiday and settled back into our routines. Some children have been busy helping clear our garden of fallen leaves which has given us lots of opportunity to talk about the signs of Autumn. We have all learnt another Poetry Basket poem called 'Falling Leaves' which the children enjoyed performing along with the actions.

Reception

The children came back confidently after the holidays and were raring to go. Most children are now coming through the door and into class in the mornings by themselves, so well done everybody! We have all enjoyed a firework themed yoga session. It is lovely to see how the children are enjoying their reading books and learning their words at home.

Key Stage 1

Year 1 have had lots of fun learning about Guy Fawkes and The Gunpowder Plot this week. They have created some wonderful firework pictures, made portraits and wanted posters of Guy Fawkes as well as discussing the sounds and colours of fireworks. We have spoken to the children about how to be safe on Bonfire Night and were really pleased with their knowledge and understanding. In maths we have been using positional language to describe where an item is positioned. Throughout the week we have worked with each child individually to assess their phonics knowledge as part of their reading.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a great start to this half term. We used the exciting theme of firework night to stimulate our poetry writing. We used onomatopoeic words such as WHOOSH, BANG and WHIZZ to great effect! We also created some amazing firework pictures with a silhouette skyline. In science we investigated how heating can change materials. We melted chocolate and then challenged the children to change it back into a solid. In maths we have explored the properties of 2D shape. What a busy four days!

Key Stage 2

Year 3

We have had a great first week back in Year 3! In English we have been learning about different forms of poetry and the different features associated with them. In our connected curriculum work we have been learning how to make bronze and where dangerous volcanoes are located in the world.

Year 4

This week Year 4 have used the sequel to 'The Day the Crayons Quit' – 'The Day the Crayons Came Home!' We practised our recall and answered questions on the text, then wrote emotive postcards and letters using empathy. The children created some fantastic, imaginative responses. In Art we looked at how the Anglo-Saxons and Normans would have had to create their own clothes by spinning and weaving, and began practising some weaving skills using paper. We needed great determination and resilience for this tricky skill but some of our woven patterns were beautiful!

Year 5

In English, Year 5 have been writing creatively using tension and building suspense. We have been using the formal method for division in maths and have increased our mathematical terminology to include the terms divisor, dividend and quotient. In geography we have begun studying mountains and locating different mountain ranges around the world.

Year 6

Year 6 children have been focusing on the poem 'The Highwayman' this week. They have learnt about the vocabulary used within the poem and its meaning. On Wednesday, the children became one of the characters and wrote a diary entry from the perspective of their chosen character. In maths, they have been focusing on fractions and learning a whole variety of strategies in order to add, subtract, order and simplify them.

There are lots of events coming up in our sporting calendar including Year 5&6 boys football competition, boccia and New age Kurling. We have also arranged some friendly netball matches that will be coming up shortly so watch this space for the news on all of our matches.
