Water Safety and Attainment Data 2019 – 2020

The DfE recognise that schools' ability to collect swimming and water safety attainment data may have been interrupted by the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. Usually we would report on the competency of our Year 6 pupils with regards to certain swimming expectations:

To:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- perform a safe self-rescue in different water based situations
- use a range of strokes effectively

However, due to the pandemic, swimming did not take place in Year 6 in the summer term and therefore no data is available for 2019-20. Data for 2020-21 will be available providing that the current Year 6 cohort is able to participate in a block of swimming this academic year.
